**E-CIGARETTES, VAPORIZERS,

PERMITTED **ONLY IN CABIN BAGGAGE**



**SPARE BATTERIES
AND POWER BANKS**

- Maximum two spare batteries or power banks per passenger
- Must be protected from short circuit
- If electronic powered device has a rate over 100 Wh and less than 160 Wh prior approval from airline is mandatory

RECOMMENDED **IN CABIN BAGGAGE**



**< 160WH MAJOR TOOLS, DRONES,
DIGITAL CAMERAS, TABLETS, LAPTOPS (2)**



- If to be carried in the checked baggage: electronic device is completely switched off and effectively protected from accidental activation. Protected from risk of accidental damage by proper packaging and not carried adjacent to flammable or pressurized material.
- If electronic powered device has a rate over 100 Wh and less than 160 Wh prior approval from airline is mandatory.

RESTRICTIONS IN CABIN



- LIQUIDS, AEROSOLS AND GELS <100ML PLACED IN A TRANSPARENT RESEALABLE BAG OF CAPACITY NOT EXCEEDING 1L
- ITEMS REQUIRED FOR MEDICAL OR DIETARY PURPOSES AND BABY FOOD PRODUCTS FOR USE DURING THE TRIP

(1) Transportation may be authorized as checked baggage upon prior approval

(2) Spare and power batteries must be individually protected to prevent short circuits

(3) Lithium battery-powered lighters without a safety cap, Blue flame or Cigar lighters, Lighter fuel and lighter refills are forbidden



EU Passenger rights:

If you are denied boarding or if your flight is cancelled or delayed for at least 2 hours, ask at your check-in counter or boarding gate for the text stating your rights particularly with regards to compensation and assistance. Regulation EC261/2004, Article 14 (1).
